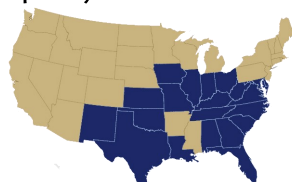
Taking the Truth to Thailand

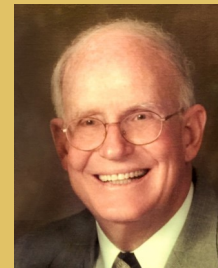
GREAT EXPECTATIONS

As we look to the new year, we are sure that 2016 will be one of the biggest years of our life and ministry! First, because Lord willing we will be meeting our son, Judah Lee, in less than three months (April 10)! If that were not exciting enough, our hope and expectation is that we will also be leaving for Thailand in September! We are continuing to pray for the Lord's provision and guidance to that end, and we ask that you would join us in doing so!

PREPARING FOR THE FIELD

We are very thankful for the love offerings and other financial gifts we have received during the past year of deputation! By God's grace and your giving, we have already been able to set aside funds for the majority of our setup costs! We have saved enough to cover six months of rent, all of our housing setup (including appliances, furniture, etc.), our utilities such as phone service, ministry equipment, the cost of Shane's language school, and half the needed funds for a vehicle!

There are, however, a few items we still need to prepare for financially. We still need to raise a total of \$18,000. This would include the other half of the vehicle cost, about \$7,500, fees for our visas and work permit, \$1,000, and the cost of Kayti's language studies for 2 years, \$10,000.
